4th Sunday of Advent (A) 21st December 2025



Christmas Season is one of the most joyful seasons of the Church's year. At Christmas we celebrate the birth of our Saviour, Jesus Christ, and the beginning of our redemption. Each year we recall the events of that incredible night two thousand years ago, when God himself was born as a tiny baby in the stable at Bethlehem, fulfilling all the prophecies of the Old Testament. We remember once again the fact that, although Jesus was both God and King, there were none

of the trappings of royalty – just a stable and a manger to serve as a cot. The message that our Saviour was born was not given first to kings or queens or heads of state, but to some lowly shepherds who were tending their flocks in the fields nearby.

The prophets of the Old Testament called the longed-for Messiah "Emmanuel", a name which means "God with us". By becoming a man, God has entered the course of human history in a way that we can see and understand, and with his birth the presence of God among his people has changed for ever.

During Christmas we also honour Our Blessed Lady for her work in our redemption. So important was her role as the Mother of God that we call her "Co Redemptrix" – a co-worker in our redemption. Mary rightly deserves the title of being "the highest honour of our race".

Let us celebrate this Christmas with our minds and hearts renewed by the love of God, who sent his only Son to win our salvation.

Feast Days This Week

Monday

St John of Kanty – He was born In Kanty in Poland on 23rd June 1390. As a priest he lectured at the university, lived an austere life and showed great charity to the poor. Certain people were envious of his reputation and were influential in removing him from his post. He spent another eight years serving a parish until his death on 24th December 1473. John taught his students, "Fight all error, but do it with good humour, kindness and love. Harshness will damage your own soul and spoil the best cause."

Thursday

St Stephen - According to the Acts of the Apostles, Stephen was a deacon of the Early Church in Jerusalem who aroused the enmity of members of various synagogues by his teachings. Accused of blasphemy, at his trial he made a long speech denouncing the Jewish authorities who were sitting in judgment on him and he was then stoned to death. Like his Master, he was full of forgiveness for his executioners. His martyrdom was witnessed by Saul of Tarsus (St Paul) who approved of the killing. He is venerated as the Protomartyr of Christianity.

Friday

St John, Apostle and Evangelist – According to the New Testament he was one of the Twelve Apostles called by Jesus. Along with Peter and James he was one of only three Apostles to witness Jesus' Transfiguration and Agony in the Garden. As well as the Fourth Gospel, John wrote three New Testament Epistles and the Book of the Apocalypse.

Saturday

Feast of the Holy Innocents – Commemorating the innocent children who were slaughtered at the orders of King Herod, in the hope that by killing every boy born in Bethlehem at the same time of Jesus he would succeed in killing the new-born King of the Jews.
